Mr. Mwang'ombe has donated hospital equipment to hospital facilities in Tanzania. Mr. Mwa'gombe provided a free seminar to Tanzanians healthcare Professional. In 2014, Mr. Mwang'ombe traveled to Tanzania with specialist physicians from USA. During that medical tour, they successful offered a free seminar that covered Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Diseases (COPD) to healthcare providers at Aga Khan hospital in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

In 2018, Mr. Mwang'ombe and colleagues from Maryland and Washington DC formed a non-profit organization, that is, Swahili Society USA (SSUSA). During that process, Mr. Mwang'ombe led that process as a chair. SSUSA core mission is to bring Swahili speaking people and friends together. In essence, like helping each other addressing socio-economic disparities and embracing Swahili culture.

In 2018, during SSUSA inauguration, Mr. Mwang'ombe helped to mobilizing 250 people who came to an inaugural dinner gala. He also invited two artists from Africa, Nigeria and Tanzania respectively. During that event, ambassadors from Uganda and Tanzania joined the inaugural ceremony.

This year, 2019, Tanzania Day Committees Board of Trustees in Dallas, Texas has recognized SSUSA for playing a supportive role to the Tanzania Day events in two consecutive years.
